CICA	Citizen Requirement for Voting Initiative	Suffrage	Amends the Colorado Constitution to state that "only a citizen" of the U.S. can vote in federal, state, and local elections, instead of the existing language that says "every citizen" of the U.S. can vote.
CISS	Gray Wolf Reintroduction Initiative	Forests and parks and Environment	Reintroduces gray wolves on public lands
VR	National Popular Vote Interstate Compact Referendum	Elections	Joins Colorado into the National Popular Vote Interstate Compact, awarding Colorado's electoral votes to the winner of the national popular vote
